Scrutiny of SPCB supported bodies

As you are aware, the Finance and Public Administration Committee published the report of our inquiry into Scotland's Commissioner Landscape: A Strategic Approach on 16 September 2024.¹ A parliamentary debate on our findings and recommendations followed on 31 October.²

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for giving evidence to the Committee as part of our inquiry on 14 May 2024, and for your letter of 15 May, providing further information on your Committee's recent scrutiny of the Patient Safety Commissioner for Scotland Bill.

As you know, our report found that the current landscape is no longer fit for purpose and called for a moratorium on creating any new SPCB supported bodies, or expanding the remit of existing bodies, until a 'root and branch' review of the structure is carried out. We found that "overall accountability, budget-setting, and scrutiny mechanisms, as set out in legislation and procedures, require an overhaul to ensure they are clearer, more robust, joined-up, and transparent".

During evidence-taking, some Commissioners told us they would like more opportunities to give evidence to committees on their performance and it was also suggested that performance and budget scrutiny should be more closely linked. A significant number of witnesses told us that parliamentary scrutiny should be enhanced with a focus on delivery of outcomes.

In response to the evidence we heard, the Committee undertook to seek views from relevant committees on how supported bodies within committee remits fulfil their functions. This evidence will help inform our enhanced scrutiny of SPCB supported body budget bids as part of our scrutiny of the overall SPCB budget bid each year.
