Dear Convener

In my letter of 17 January setting out the next steps for the development of data and digital elements of the National Care Service I noted that I would update Committee on the outcomes of three tender exercises.

These three projects are focussed on developing a robust evidence base for decisions relating to the data and digital plans for the National Care Service (NCS). Data and digital will be key enablers of the NCS and I am clear this investment is an important foundation for the work ahead.

The projects are:

- what digital approaches, services and products have enabled similar services outside
 of Scotland and what lessons can be learned from both successful and unsuccessful
 digital projects and programmes. This will focus on the technical and practical
 elements of work rather than the policy drivers;
- 2. user research to explore how people experience interacting with services in Scotland, and is particularly focussed on what data is important to them; and
- 3. a review of the technology, service and digital architectural landscape across the public, private and third sector organisations who are involved in the delivery of social care services in Scotland to understand what will and will not work in the system.
