

Timing of Review	All subject committees	Recommendation that the initial review takes place earlier than the two years specified.	The framework has been amended to clarify that a review will take place after one year (opposed to two years as initially drafted).
Stakeholder Engagement	Subject committees in all devolved legislatures	Recommendations advised on the need to explicitly state which stakeholders would be engaged with during the initial review of the framework.	The framework has been amended to state that stakeholders will be invited to take part in the review process (namely the appropriate competent authorities, local authorities, industry and environmental groups).
International Obligations	Welsh and Scottish Parliament Committees	Recommendations on the need to comprehensively reflect all appropriate international	No changes have been made regarding international obligations as the framework content is

HSE / HSE Involvement	House of Commons Select Committee	Recommendation to engage with HSE and HSE / NI in the event of any proposed legislative divergence	It was agreed this detail was already included in the hazardous substances (planning) common framework. A footnote was added to clarify.
Provision of a concordat	House of Lords Select Committee	Regret that a concordat has not been published alongside the provisional framework	It was agreed that the common framework contains sufficient detail on the operation of the hazardous substances (planning) common framework and a concordat would duplicate this detail. Reference to a concordat has been removed.
