Independent Monitoring of Satellite tags fitted to raptors (PE 1750)

At its <u>meeting on 15 March 2022</u>, the Net Zero, Energy and Transport Committee considered the above petition. The petition calls on the Scottish Parliament to urge the Scottish Government to introduce independent monitoring of satellite tags fitted to raptor species, to assist the police and courts in potential wildlife crime cases and to provide data transparency.

The Official Report for this meeting is available on the Scottish Parliament's website.

We agreed to seek further information and views from NatureScot regarding the implementation of the new data-sharing protocols in the first year of the satellite tagging scheme and the robustness of the data being gathered.

In its <u>report to the Scottish Government published in November 2019</u>, the Grouse Moor Management Review Group recommended "more thorough regulation of the fitting and use of satellite tags coupled with more expeditious sharing of information". It also recommended that NatureScot should ensure that the licences issued for satellite-tracking of tagged raptors include a condition that commits the data holder (i.e. the owner of the tag) to be listed on a register of data holders. Another recommendations was that Police Scotland and NatureScot should cooperate expeditiously in sharing data regarding tagged birds found dead or missing in suspicious circumstances.

We note from the Scottish Government's <u>November 2020 response to the review</u> that NatureScot had agreed new data-sharing protocols for all permit holders who

wish to employ satellite-based tracking of tagged raptors birds under licence with the British Trust for Ornithology. The response also said that these protocols would be in place for the start of the 2021 tagging season, implementing the above recommendations.

We would welcome an update on the performance of the protocols since their implementation in 2021, including Information on their impact and any associated data, to help us come to an informed view on issues raised in the petition.

For information, and as you will see from the Official Report, we are also writing to Police Scotland and to the Scottish Government in similar terms.

We would appreciate a response by 1 June 2022.
