# Convener's Welcome

Jackson Carlaw MSP, Convener opened the meeting by welcoming all members. He mentioned that we are not with the embassy tonight, but instead focusing responsibility on the economic, educational, and cultural links between Scotland and Israel. Jackson introduced the group to guest speaker, Israeli author Lavie Tidhar to discuss his book *Adama*.

# Members contributions

Jackson invited Deputy Convener Fergus Ewing MSP to say a few words. Fergus spoke about the events of October 7<sup>th</sup> 2023 and that nearly a year later and hostages have still not been freed. He mentioned he was concerned that the debate in Scotland has become very one-sided and the importance of working towards peace between Israel and Palestine.

A non-MSP attendee made the point that the Israel/Palestine conflict has been singled out as the most emotive conflict in the world.

John Mason MSP discussed the National Jewish Assembly.

Jackson Carlaw MSP mentioned he will be in London the following week and, amongst other meetings, will be at the Israeli embassy for one such meeting.
