Meeting on 08/12/2023

In the meeting the group discussed the role of business in building a Wellbeing Economy and was held online. Members heard contributions from the Cabinet Secretary for Wellbeing Economy, Fair Work and Energy as well as representatives from cooperatives and social enterprises. The meeting was attended by 3 MSP members as well as about 65 non-MSPs representing group members and invited guests.

Meeting on 23/04/2023

In the meeting, group members discussed how land reform can help to build a Wellbeing Economy in Scotland. Panellists included contributions from Community Land Scotland, Future Economy Scotland, Scottish Land and Estates and the Scottish Land Commission. The meeting was Attended by 4 MSP members of the group, 2 non-member MSPs, as well as about 100 non-MSPs representing group members and invited guests. The meeting was held in hybrid format with about 70 people attending online and 30 in person.

AGM on 06/09/2023

The meeting re-elected Maggie Chapman MSP and Emma Harper MSP as co-conveners for the coming year and re-appointed WEAll Scotland as the secretariat. In the meeting, group members discussed the topic of how the proposals for a Wellbeing & Sustainable Development Bill can help redesign our economy. The meeting featured panel contributions from Sarah Boyack MSP, the Wellbeing Economy Alliance Scotland, Prof. Matthew Hannon and Sophie Howe. The meeting was attended by 3 MSP members as well as ca. 55 non-MSPs representing group members and invited guests.
