#### Agenda item 4: Liam McArthur MSP Bill update

Liam McArthur advised the audience that his Bill was currently subject to public consultation and scrutiny by the Health, Social Care and Sport Committee, the Delegated Powers Committee and the Finance Committee of the Scottish Parliament.

The Health Committee issued two calls for views which were open for submissions between Friday 7 June and Friday 16 August 2024:

- a short call for views for people who wished to express general opinions about the Bill as a whole.
- a detailed call for views for people, groups, bodies or organisations who wished to comment on specific aspects of the Bill.

The Scottish Parliament Information Centre (SPICe) is in the process of producing a detailed analysis of responses to both calls for views.

Tom Davies, Dignity in Dying UK gave an update on the various attempts at legalising assisted dying across the UK. This included detailed information from Jersey, Guernsey, the Isle of Man, Ireland and Westminster.
