# Meeting with the Scottish Biometrics Commissioner

1. The SPCB held its annual meeting with the Scottish Biometrics Commissioner (SBC). The SPCB welcomed Dr Brian Plastow, the Commissioner and Ross Macdonald, SBC Director to the meeting.

- 2. During the discussion, the SBC outlined ways in which it keeps up to date with developments in biometrics technologies and how it is engaging the public in its work. Other areas covered included its work with a range of strategic partners, and the positive outcome of the first Biometrics in Criminal Justice Conference, which the SBC co-hosted with Police Scotland and the Scottish Police Authority. The work of the SPCB Supported Bodies Landscape Review Committee was also discussed during the meeting.
- 3. The SPCB thanked Dr Plastow and Mr Macdonald for their attendance.

#### Meeting with the Electoral Commission

- 4. The SPCB welcomed Dame Sue Bruce, Commissioner with responsibility for Scotland, Vijay Rangarajan, Chief Executive Officer, Jackie Killeen, Director of Electoral Administration and Regulation, Andy O'Neil, Head of Electoral Commission Scotland and Natalie Mauchline, Senior Communications and Engagement Officer (Scotland).
- 5. The SPCB discussed a range of matters with the Electoral Commission (EC). This included the work it is progressing to support voters and encourage participation, and to support local election teams to deliver forthcoming elections. The EC also highlighted ways in which it is working to help voters identify disinformation during election campaigns and the strengthened protections it has put in place against cyber threats.
- 6. The SPCB thanked the Electoral Commission for attending.
