*S6M-15825 Katy Clark: ScotRail Reduction to Ticket Office Opening Hours—That the Parliament understands that the rail operator, ScotRail, is proceeding with plans to reduce ticket office opening hours at 101 of its 143 staffed stations; is concerned about what it sees as the potential impact on passenger accessibility, safety, security, guality of service and access to rail products and services of these proposals, and believes that certain groups, such as disabled and older people and women and girls, may be particularly impacted; considers that ticket offices provide a fixed location for passengers to locate staff and are a place of safety for both passengers and staff; understands that, through schedule 17 of the Ticketing and Settlement Agreement, ticket office staffing is the only regulated station staffing, and, therefore, if there are reductions in ticket office hours, there are no future safeguards regarding station staffing levels; further understands that ScotRail is basing these proposals on a public consultation, which was undertaken in January 2022 by the former operator, Abellio; notes with concern that, in this public consultation, 98% of respondents opposed the proposals; understands that members of the RMT, TSSA and ASLEF unions are currently campaigning to oppose these plans; further understands that, as ScotRail is owned by the Scottish Government, the Cabinet Secretary for Transport was required to authorise ScotRail's proposals, and calls, therefore, on the Scottish Government to instruct ScotRail to withdraw its plans to reduce ticket office hours at 101 stations and provide a commitment to retaining all existing ticket office hours and staffing levels.

*<u>S6M-15824</u> Finlay Carson: South of Scotland Cycling Partnership Nominated for Top Global Award—That the Parliament congratulates South of Scotland Cycling Partnership on its efforts to become one of the world's leading cycling destinations, having been nominated for a global award in the inaugural UCI Cycling for All and Sustainability Awards in the UCI Bike City Category; recognises that its submission, entitled *Unlocking the Power of the Bike*, follows on from the south of Scotland becoming the first region in Scotland to achieve the UCI Bike Region Label in 2023 after recognising its commitment to both elite cycling competition and cycling for all; notes that the south of Scotland will be competing against Copenhagen in Denmark and Wollongong in Australia for the award, which will be announced by the UCI during the 2024 UCI Mobility and Bike City Forum being held in Abu Dhabi on 18-19 December 2024; acknowledges other achievements by the Partnership, including the launch of the 10-year strategy that aims to make the region one of the top cycling destinations in the world, gaining the UCI Bike Region Label, hosting three

events at the 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships that attracted over 65 million broadcast viewers from across the globe, while also officially launching the Kirkpatrick C2C, the south of Scotland's coast-to-coast cycle route, which offers 250 miles of uninterrupted joy for experienced cyclists from Stranraer to Eyemouth, and wishes the Partnership continued success in the coming months.

*<u>S6M-15821</u> Alexander Stewart: Angharad Evans and Paige van der Westhuizen to Represent the University of Stirling at the World Short Course Swimming Championships— That the Parliament welcomes the news that Angharad Evans and Paige van der Westhuizen, who will be representing Great Britain and Zimbabwe respectively, will also represent the University of Stirling at the World Short Course Swimming Championships in Budapest; understands that the global event takes place in a 25-metre pool, compared with the regular 50metre lengths, with both Angharad and Paige set to be busy over the course of the meet; believes that Angharad, who made her Olympic debut in Paris earlier in 2024, will compete for Great Britain in three races, the 50m, 100m and 200m breaststroke, while Paige will represent Zimbabwe in the 100m and 200m freestyle events; notes that the university's coaching staff will also travel to the Hungarian capital, with Brad Hay selected for Great Britain alongside Stirling's former head performance swim coach, Steve Tigg, who is now head swim coach of Aquatics GB, while Josh Williamson will coach with Zimbabwe; further notes that Ben Higson, who is replacing Tigg as head performance swim coach, is also in Budapest with the Australian team, and wishes all of the University of Stirling team the very best of luck in this prestigious competition.

*<u>S6M-15820</u> Alexander Stewart: Duncan Scott MBE, Scottish Sportsperson of the Year 2024—That the Parliament welcomes the news that the University of Stirling swimmer, Duncan Scott MBE, has added another coveted award to his collection after being crowned Scottish Sportsperson of the Year at the Scottish Sports Awards 2024; understands that Duncan took the top award at the black tie event at Glasgow Science Centre after enjoying a phenomenal year in the pool, which saw him become Scotland's most decorated Olympian with his gold and silver medals in Paris, taking him to eight Olympic medals; considers that Duncan, who had been named Male Athlete of the Year earlier in the night, was shortlisted for the Lonsdale Trophy alongside the golfer, Robert MacIntyre, and the cyclist, Jack Carlin; notes that this latest success comes just weeks after Scott was announced as Aquatics GB's Swimming Athlete of the Year, as well as Swimmer of the Year at the Scottish Swimming Awards, where he was also the recipient of the JY Coutts Memorial Award and the Nancy Riach Memorial Award; acknowledges that Duncan been almost a decade on the high-performance programme at Stirling, which is Scotland's University for Sporting Excellence, and commends Duncan on his truly sterling endeavours in his sport.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
