*S6M-15868 Emma Harper: Eating Disorders Awareness Week 2025—That the Parliament recognises that the week of 24 February to 2 March is Eating Disorders Awareness Week 2025, and that the theme is that anyone can be affected by an eating disorder; understands that eating disorders affect at least one in 50 people across Scotland, including people of all ages, genders and backgrounds, with anorexia nervosa having a higher mortality rate than any other mental health condition, and that there is a range of recognised eating disorders; further understands that the sooner someone is treated for an eating disorder, the better their chance of making a full recovery, but that people too often delay seeking help due to perceived stigma and misconceptions about who can develop an eating disorder; welcomes the work of Beat, a UK-wide charity supporting people living with eating disorders and their families; understands that Beat continues to provide help across Scotland through funding from the Scottish Government; notes what it sees as the importance of protecting vital eating disorder services during the current fiscal challenges, and further notes the calls encouraging anyone in Scotland concerned about an eating disorder to contact their GP surgery and reach out to Beat on 0808 801 0432 or at beateating disorders.org.uk.

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*S6M-15865 Alexander Stewart: Scottish Autism's Christmas Market Raises £1,700—That the Parliament expresses delight that a Christmas market has raised around £1,700 to support services for people living with autism; understands that Scottish Autism's Christmas market, held at its Art Opportunities service in Alloa, brought people in who bought artwork, sweet treats and wreaths; commends members of the local community who turned out in significant numbers to support the event, and who helped raise such an excellent sum; understands that the funds raised will be used to ensure that the organisation has plenty of materials available to support the creative endeavours of the people who attend its services, and congratulates everyone involved on their highly magnanimous endeavours.

*S6M-15863 Craig Hoy: Praising Poppy Appeal Success in East Lothian—That the Parliament praises the residents of Longniddry for their outstanding efforts in raising money for the Poppy Appeal; understands that, as a village, a total of £2,638.10 has been raised; extends its praise to all volunteers who participated in door-to-door collections; understands the importance of this funding in providing what it sees as life-changing services to Armed Forces communities, such as advice and guidance, recovery and rehabilitation services, and supporting the transition to civilian life, and encourages the Scottish Government to continue to support what it considers to be these vital charities.

*S6M-15862 Craig Hoy: Tweed Valley Mountain Rescue —That the Parliament commends the work of Tweed Valley Mountain Rescue during this busy time of the year; understands that, in October 2024, the team experienced its busiest month on record, spending almost 400 hours attending 13 incidents, including missing person searches, evacuating hillwalkers, and treating injured mountain bikers; further understands that, as a charity, the team relies on donations to keep operating; recognises that 30% of call-outs are for missing people and that the team is currently campaigning to raise £3,000 for thermal imaging camera equipment to assist it in carrying out this work as it moves into the darker months, and encourages the Scottish Government to support what it sees as these vital services.

*S6M-15861 Craig Hoy: Welcoming the Extension of Torness Nuclear Power Station—That the Parliament welcomes the decision by EDF Energy to extend Torness Power Station's life by two years, meaning that it will continue to generate power until 2030; understands that, as a result, approximately 750 jobs and apprenticeships in East Lothian will continue to be supported and tens of millions of pounds will flow back into the local economy; believes that Torness Power Station is Scotland's most productive clean energy asset, thus far producing enough clean energy to power every home in Scotland for 30 years, cutting 100 million tonnes of CO2; understands that dependable and geographically concentrated power from Torness will stabilise balancing and transmission costs in Scotland, which are currently the highest in the UK; considers that this will in turn bolster the UK's energy security and reduce dependence on imported gas; commends the station's commitment to safety through regular inspections and assessments; calls on the Scottish Government to reconsider its position on nuclear power and recognise nuclear energy as a safe, reliable and clean alternative, and wishes the Torness employees and contractors continued success in their hard work keeping the station functioning and productive at such a high level.

*<u>S6M-15860</u> Craig Hoy: Praise for Asda Charity Funding for East Lothian Primary School— That the Parliament praises the Asda Cashpot for Schools scheme, which has contributed nearly £5.8 million to UK primary schools; recognises that this funding enables schools to invest in various resources and projects; understands that, in Scotland, a total of £614,326 was raised;

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acknowledges that, among the participating primary schools in Scotland, Dunbar Primary School ranked in the top 10 for donations, receiving £4,214, and notes that the scheme ran between September and November 2024, with 0.5% of the value of shopping conducted through Asda Rewards being donated to local primary schools, as chosen by customers.
