**\*[S6M-13635](#) Stephanie Callaghan: 80th Anniversary of One Parent Families Scotland**—That the Parliament congratulates One Parent Families Scotland on its remarkable 80th anniversary, and commends the charity for its tireless efforts in empowering single parents to reach their full potential; understands that the charity provides a range of essential support services, including family, employability, young parent support and welfare rights and financial advice at its five local family centres in Dundee, Edinburgh, Falkirk, Glasgow, and North Lanarkshire, as well as through a national lone parent helpline and digital support services; notes that the charity, originally founded in the 1940s as the Scottish Council for the Unmarried Mother and her Child, was established with the aim of keeping unmarried mothers and their children together; celebrates the charity's growth into what it sees as an impactful organisation, employing 97 members of staff, supporting over 8,000 parents, children and young people annually, and providing welfare rights and financial advice that it considers has benefited nearly 4,000 families, resulting in financial gains for families of over £1.6 million; recognises that one in four families with children in Scotland are single-parent families, with 90% of those being women; considers that, despite significant improvements since the 1940s, gender inequality remains a major cause of discrimination against many single mothers; understands that single parents face unique challenges, combining the roles of sole carer and provider without the ability to pool resources with another adult, often resulting in a higher likelihood of poverty compared to other households; applauds the charity for what it sees as its pivotal role in advocating for single parents across all levels of government, striving to achieve lasting solutions to the poverty that many face, and celebrates what it considers to be the resilience of single parents and the amazing job that they do as parents.

**\*[S6M-13652](#) Alexander Stewart: Pulmonary Rehabilitation Week 2024**—That the Parliament acknowledges Pulmonary Rehabilitation Week, which for 2024 is running from 17 to 21 June; understands that around one in five people in Scotland live with a lung condition, with around

140,000 people having chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), which is a long-term chronic lung condition causing extreme breathlessness that can have a huge impact on a person's quality of life; further understands that it usually develops because of long-term damage to the lungs from breathing in a harmful substance, usually cigarette smoke, as well as smoke from other sources, air pollution and other contaminants, including from vocations where people are exposed to dust, fumes and chemicals; notes that pulmonary rehabilitation is a treatment programme for COPD that consists of a minimum of six weeks of physical training, disease education and nutritional, psychological, social and behavioural intervention, delivered by a multi-disciplinary team; further notes that the course will typically consist of an hour of exercise and an hour of education specifically tailored for people with a lung condition and that, depending on the particular programme, the exercise will be led by a physiotherapist or an exercise instructor, with the education being led by different healthcare professionals depending on the exact topic of the day; acknowledges that, historically, pulmonary rehabilitation took place in a hospital centre, but that many programmes are now delivered in community centres and sometimes leisure centres; understands that the courses are free to access for patients and have been proven to be far more cost effective than inhalers; considers that smoking cessation and flu vaccinations should also be a priority as part of this treatment; expresses deep concern, however, at reports that waiting lists are far too high and that people are not getting the services that they need; understands that pulmonary rehabilitation classes were forced to stop during the COVID-19 pandemic when staff were redeployed, venues taken away and it was not possible to bring vulnerable people together; further understands that this resulted in a considerable build-up of waiting lists that remain a problem to this day; considers that investing in pulmonary rehabilitation helps to increase physical activity and reduces the risk of people with lung conditions being admitted to hospital, and commends the work of charities such as Asthma + Lung UK Scotland and all the professionals involved in the provision of pulmonary rehabilitation for their tireless endeavours focusing on the provision of this vital treatment. **R**
