*<u>S6M-15168</u> Gillian Martin: Climate Change (Emissions Reduction Targets) (Scotland) Bill— That the Parliament agrees that the Climate Change (Emissions Reduction Targets) (Scotland) Bill be passed.

*<u>S6M-15165</u> Daniel Johnson: Supporting People with Learning Disabilities, Autism and Neurodivergence—That the Parliament notes its disappointment at reports that the promised Learning Disability, Autism and Neurodivergence Bill was not announced in the most recent Programme for Government; believes that people with learning disabilities, autism and neurodivergence in Lothian and across Scotland are structurally excluded and disadvantaged, and that it is harder for them to achieve their potential than people who are neurotypical; considers that the measures included in the draft Bill, such as creating and upholding statutory rights, improving access to mental health services and tailoring education provision, would break down some of the barriers faced by people with learning disabilities, autism or neurodivergence, given that a reported 37% of schoolchildren reportedly have additional support needs but that only 6% of teachers are trained to provide these, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to provide clarity on its commitment to legislating in this area. **R**

*<u>S6M-15164</u> Daniel Johnson: Concerning Figures About Violence Against Public Service Staff Set Out in Unison Scotland Report—That the Parliament acknowledges what it sees as the important work carried out by Unison Scotland in publishing, *"It's not part of the job", violence at work report 2024*; notes that the report found 65.875 incidents of violence, or 180 incidents per day, against public service staff; is concerned that these figures suggest a 20% increase in violent incidents since 2023; is further concerned that violent incidents against local authority staff have reportedly risen by 14% year on year, and that NHS boards accounted for a quarter of all violent incidents in 2024, and notes the calls for further steps to be taken to ensure that public service workers in Lothian and across Scotland are protected in their place of work. **R**

*<u>S6M-15170</u> Pauline McNeill: SFE Digital Skills and Careers Hub in Glasgow—That the Parliament welcomes the jobs and skills base that Barclays Campus has brought to Glasgow; commends the new hub, created by the Scottish Financial Enterprise (SFE), in its aims to address accessibility and issues of perception in the finance sector; recognises that a recent survey from SFE and Citypress found that 40% of people in Scotland do not believe that they have the right qualifications to work in financial services, while almost a quarter of people (24%) believe that the industry is elitist; notes that the new hub aims to demystify some of the industry jargon and encourage people from a variety of backgrounds to go into a career in the finance, and considers that the campus has the potential to break down the traditional barriers that are faced by those considering a career in the finance sector.

*S6M-15167 Kenneth Gibson: Recognition of Dalry Community Garden Project as West of Scotland High Street Hero—That the Parliament congratulates the Dalry Community Development Hub on its Dalry Community Garden project being named the High Street Hero for the West of Scotland; acknowledges the judges' recognition of the project's creation of new opportunities for people and growing of fruit and vegetables for residents; notes that the garden was launched in 2021 on land gifted by a local businessman to create a safe and supportive outdoor space following the COVID-19 pandemic; commends the garden for becoming a hub of the community where volunteers utilise their skills in crafts, artwork, planting, bonsai, cooking, bird watching, photography and learning; celebrates the various events held at the garden, including a Santa's grotto, numeracy and literacy through games sessions, schools garden visits and a winter soup kitchen using produce grown there; congratulates the Dalry Community Development Hub on being named a runner-up in the Scotland Loves Local Awards' Most Enterprising Community category for its wider work to improve life in Dalry, including initiatives such as the Bypass Art Group, the Skirt the Skeith road run, the Lynn Glen trail and the Balmore and Pennyland Bees, and wishes chair. Sheena Woodside, and everyone involved in the Dalry Community Development Hub continued success in their endeavours to support the wellbeing of the community.

*<u>S6M-15166</u> Jackie Baillie: We Promise Award for Dumbarton Academy—That the Parliament congratulates Dumbarton Academy on receiving the We Promise Award; welcomes its commitment to improving the educational outcomes for its care-experienced young people; notes that it achieved this after 70% of its staff completed professional learning to enhance the support they are able to give to ensure they are encouraging the young people to reach their full potential in a safe, cared for and respected manner; understands that this professional learning provides them with further understanding of The Promise and the commitments it has set out to improve inclusion and outcomes in education through focusing on the specific needs of care-experienced children and young people, and thanks all of the staff for giving children in their care what it sees as the best possible educational experience.

*<u>S6M-15163</u> Ben Macpherson: Commending #MEAction Scotland—That the Parliament commends the important work of #MEAction Scotland and its dedication to supporting and campaigning for health equality for people with myalgic encephalomyelitis (ME) across Scotland; understands that ME, otherwise known as chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS), is a profoundly debilitating, complex, energy-limiting disease, affecting multiple systems within the body, and currently affects around 58,000 people in Scotland, with increasing numbers of those with long COVID meeting the diagnosis for ME; believes that #MEAction Scotland is doing essential work, including raising awareness of the connection with long COVID and promoting the findings of the

Prevention of Future Deaths Report published in England in October 2024, which was carried out after the death of 27-year-old Maeve Boothby O'Neill, who had severe ME, and expresses gratitude to, and admiration for, the staff and volunteers at #MEAction Scotland for campaigning to help make sure that those with ME in Scotland have access to the appropriate care, support and specialist treatment now and in the future.

*S6M-15162 Michael Matheson: Action for Children Report, I Don't Want to go Down That Road—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of Action for Children's (AfC) report into criminal exploitation of children and young people, I Don't Want to go Down That Road; understands that this is the first follow up report to the Jay Review of Criminally Exploited Children, which was published in March 2024 and was an extensive UK-wide review of exploitation, led by Professor Alexis Jay CBE; notes that criminal exploitation is a is a form of child abuse in which a child is coerced into committing criminal acts, which can happen to any child; notes that the Jay Review considers that there is no "one-type" of exploited child; acknowledges that AfC launched its criminal exploitation intervention, Service in Scotland, in 2012, which is dedicated to supporting children and young people aged 11 to 18 and their families when the child is experiencing criminal exploitation or deemed at risk; notes that this has since expanded its reach to England and Wales and has helped over 500 children since 2020; considers it important to recognise the five key themes identified through the report as intended harms caused to children and young people; notes that these are behaviours linked to exploitation, vulnerability and unintended consequences, children and young people who cause harm as a result of exploitation and the narrative around those who are exploited; further notes the report found 107 assaults on children and young people out of 179 incidents, including two fatal stabbings, multiple assaults with weapons and acidattacks, while there were 21 incidences of children being trafficked by exploiters; believes that the analysis of this report found multiple occurrences of behaviours including dealing drugs or missing episodes where they were likely to have been exploited for criminality; acknowledges that 80% of those supported by AfC, who are exploited and are over 16, are either homeless or in temporary accommodation, with the report finding that 68% were not in education, employment or training, and that 59% of the 140 children and young people, on whom the report is based, are neurodiverse; considers that listening to children and young people who have experienced criminal exploitation as vital in the efforts to tackle this issue, noting that consistency, trust and reliability are key to supporting those in this situation; aligns with the values contained in the report that everyone's collective responsibility should be in ensuring that criminal exploitation cannot be allowed to continue; believes that the report is the first step on a path to reframing the narrative around the criminalisation of children and young people who are being exploited, and looks forward to engaging further with AfC, the Scottish Government and other agencies to ensure all is done to stop the criminal exploitation of children and young people.

*<u>S6M-15161</u> Audrey Nicoll: Portlethen and District Community Allotment Association Awarded National Lottery Funding for Coastal Growing Tunnel—That the Parliament congratulates Portlethen and District Community Allotment Association on being awarded an £8,382 grant from the National Lottery Community Fund; recognises that this will allow it to purchase a solid polycarbonate growing tunnel designed to withstand the region's coastal winds, which will provide a resilient space for growing seedlings and hosting community gatherings all year-round, and commends the association's commitment to creating a sustainable and inclusive community space that promotes gardening and resilience among residents.

*<u>S6M-15159</u> Clare Adamson: Road Safety Week 2024—That the Parliament acknowledges that 17 November marks the beginning of Road Safety Week 2024; understands that the annual initiative, originating in 1997, is organised by the charity, Brake, which aims to raise awareness of road safety issues; believes that thousands of organisations, schools and communities participate each year, using the week to amplify their voices in support of safer, healthier daily commutes; notes that the theme this year is "Every Victim Counts"; recognises that the week reminds people of the devastating impact of road crashes and celebrates those who support families affected by road deaths or serious injuries; understands that 17,000 people die every year on UK roads and a further 30,000 receive serious, life-changing injuries; commends the work of Brake, and other safety charities, on campaigning for the awareness of this important issue; further commends the effort of volunteers, emergency services and safety professionals in reducing the casualties and providing care and compassion for those affected by road incidents, and wishes everyone involved with Road Safety Week all the best for this year and future campaigns.
