Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S6M-14871 David Torrance: 10% Increase in Prevalence of MS in Scotland Found by MS **Society**—That the Parliament thanks the MS Society for its work in conducting a new study, which has reportedly discovered that the number of people living in Scotland, including in Kirkcaldy, with multiple sclerosis (MS) has increased by 10%, and that the latest MS prevalence figure for Scotland is now estimated to be more than 17,000, which is higher than the 2019 figure of 15,000; understands that the sharp rise is thought to be due to a combination of factors, including better diagnosis and people with MS living longer, rather than simply an increase in the risk of developing MS, and that the new data shows that there are now estimated to be more than 150,000 people living with MS across the whole of the UK, up from an estimated 130,000; further understands that 73% of people with MS in Scotland are female, meaning that almost three times as many females live with the condition compared with males, and that people are most likely to be diagnosed in their 30s and 40s but that MS can affect people of all ages, ethnic backgrounds and genders, and notes the belief that this new data highlights the need for further investment into neurological services to support those with MS, particularly given reports that the UK currently ranks 44 out of 45 European nations for the number of neurologists for each person with a neurological condition.

*<u>S6M-14876</u> Pam Duncan-Glancy: World Arthritis Day—That the Parliament notes that World Arthritis Day takes place on 12 October 2024; understands that arthritis and other musculoskeletal (MSK) conditions are a major cause of pain and disability, affecting one in three people in Scotland of all ages; understands that MSK conditions make up around a quarter of work-related illness in Scotland, and that MSK conditions are associated with the worst quality of life scores in Scotland, compared with many other conditions; further understands that it is widely predicted that the prevalence and impact of MSK conditions will increase as a result of the population ageing, and that the number of people in Scotland needing medical interventions, such as hip and knee replacements, will also increase; congratulates the charity, Versus Arthritis, on its work across Scotland to increase awareness and deliver services and support for people living with arthritis and other MSK conditions; believes that finding ways to prevent disability from arthritis and MSK

conditions is a major and important challenge, and encourages all MSPs to mark World Arthritis Day and show their solidarity by supporting this motion.

*<u>S6M-14875</u> Clare Haughey: Welcoming the 18th Scottish Mental Health Arts Festival—That the Parliament welcomes the 18th edition of the Scottish Mental Health Arts Festival, organised by the Mental Health Foundation; notes that 2024's overarching festival theme is In/Visible, to encourage exploration of how the arts can be used to make mental health more visible, challenge stigma and support people to live mentally healthier lives; further notes that the festival programme includes a range of events across Scotland in October, including workshops and events in the Rutherglen constituency, and commends the festival for its efforts to provide a platform for people to create and share work that challenges perceptions of mental ill health, and make health-promoting connections within local communities.
