Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S6M-16524 Colin Beattie: Three Years of Solidarity with Ukraine—That the Parliament renews its solidarity with the people of Ukraine, three years on from what it understands was Russia's illegal full-scale invasion on 24 February 2022; praises the bravery and resilience of the Ukrainian people as, it believes, they continue to resolutely defend their sovereign nation from Russian aggression; condemns absolutely the reported war crimes that have been committed in Ukraine by the regime of Vladimir Putin; notes the support for the European Parliament resolution of 23 January 2025, which called on the Russian Federation to immediately terminate all military activities and withdraw from Ukraine; welcomes the news that European neighbours, including the Baltic states, have made what it sees as significant progress in detaching themselves from dependence on Russian energy; reinforces Scotland's place among the democratic nations of Europe in their support for Ukraine against what it considers is Russian authoritarianism; notes that a reported over 28,000 displaced people have arrived in the UK from Ukraine with a sponsor in Scotland, and that over 21,000 of them came through the Scottish Government's Super Sponsor Scheme; praises the hard work and compassion of communities, including in Midlothian North and Musselburgh, as they welcome displaced Ukrainian people to settle in Scotland; considers that these Ukrainian people have made a rich contribution to Scotland's communities; notes the support for a warm Scottish future for displaced Ukrainian people, including through continued investment by the Scottish Government and local authorities in longer-term resettlement for displaced Ukrainians; further notes the call on the UK Government to provide security and clarity through further extensions to the Homes for Ukraine schemes, as well as provide the fair and proportionate allocation of "thank you" payments to hosts in Scotland, and celebrates what it believes has been Scotland's long history of solidarity with displaced people, refugees and asylum seekers from around the world.

*S6M-16515 Maggie Chapman: World Social Justice Day—That the Parliament recognises that World Social Justice Day, observed annually on 20 February, aims to promote equality, fairness and human rights for all, regardless of gender, race, nationality, disability or social status; understands that, in 2007, the United Nations General Assembly declared World Social Justice Day, starting from the 63rd session, to be celebrated every year to contribute to the international community's efforts in poverty eradication, the promotion of full employment and decent work, gender equity and access to social wellbeing and justice for all; acknowledges 2025's theme, "Strengthening a Just Transition for a Sustainable Future", and calls for the support of policies and strategies that foster sustainable development, economic growth and job opportunities, particularly for marginalised or disadvantaged communities across the North East Scotland region; notes what it sees as the responsibility of the Scottish Parliament to recognise the impact of the oil and gas industry, particularly in the north east, and to ensure that workers impacted by the decline of this sector are provided with retraining opportunities and access to work and sustainable opportunities that promote both economic and environmental development, and addresses any disparities between urban and rural communities, particularly in Aberdeenshire and Angus, with a focus on improving access to essential services such as healthcare, education and social support systems, ensuring equitable service provision across the region; highlights the reported ongoing challenges of multiple deprivation, particularly in Dundee, where communities continue to face high levels of poverty, unemployment and inequality, and calls for targeted measures to support job creation, improved access to education and healthcare, and the implementation of social programmes that tackle the root causes of deprivation and promote inclusion.

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further understands with concern that the refusal of citizenship denies these same people security and a safe, permanent home, and urges the UK Government to reconsider this policy.

Proposals for Member's Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
